- Over 2,500 COVID positive cases in our schools since August 10

Academics Improving



Math

- Manatee District 4th and 5th graders topped statewide results by 11 percentage points.
- Manatee District 6th graders topped statewide results by 9 percentage points.
- Manatee District 3rd and 7th graders topped statewide results by 7 percentage points.

Reading

 Manatee District students maintained their reading scores better than the state overall in 7 of 8 grades tested.

Science (tests only 5th and 8th graders)

- Manatee District fifth graders topped statewide results by 1 percentage point.
- Manatee District eighth graders trailed state results by 1 percentage point.


- Originally passed in 2018 by 51%
